Naples Green was designed to provide neighborhood beautification, new green space, traffic calming improvements and a safe and enjoyable environment for residents to host and accommodate neighborhood events and activities. The work scope included the transformation of approximately 7,500 square feet of concrete and asphalt into new green public open space. Designed by Jane Martin, Shift Design Studio, Naples Green consists of landscaped areas with hundreds of new plants and 18 new trees, raised planter beds and pathways all come together to provide an inviting new open space. By removing concrete and asphalt, the Naples Green also provides storm water benefits by allowing rainwater to permeate into the ground instead of flowing into the sewer system.

This project was made possible by the San Francisco Planning Department and the San Francisco Department of Public Works in collaboration with the Outer Mission Merchants and Residents Association, the Excelsior Action Group and the San Francisco Clean City Coalition, with funding from The Wells Fargo Foundation.
